Wattisfield Parish Council – Wattisfield Recreation Ground & Community Centre Committee

Progress with the Village Hall Redevelopment Group looking at the Future of the Village Hall.

The working group was formed to look at the future of the village hall and met first in November 2021.

Having decided their priorities, they commissioned Whitworth Surveyors to look at the building and cost the repairs to enable the WG to determine if the building could be saved or if a new build would be the better option. The survey was carried out in April 2022 and showed a spend of approx £83K would be necessary to repair the building. This is clearly the cheaper option and the WG concluded the building would be retained.

A survey was distributed to all the village and only 44 questionnaires were returned, about 20%. Here parishioners were able to say what they thought of the village hall and what it should be used for in the future.

The WG have taken those opinions into account and are now at the stage of commissioning an architect to give a feasibility study of three scenarios, a low, medium and high spend refurbishment. When complete, parishioners will be able to inspect the plans and give their views on the best way forward for the village hall.

Hedge Trimming Time

It's that time of year again when garden and field hedges need to be trimmed. The bird nesting season is over, and any overgrown hedges now need to be cut back, particularly where they overhang the road. Keep hedges well

back from the highway. Overhanging branches and stems cause a hazard to pedestrians, horse-riders and cyclists and can cause scratches to motor vehicles so if you're responsible for a hedge, now is the time to trim it up.

If your trees are close to power lines, please make sure these branches don't touch the live wires. Where power lines are close, consult with UK Power Networks before you trim these trees & hedges.

Wattisfield Biodiversity Project

The group met for the first time in August and agreed that a good first project would be to map the current land use in the parish to identify any wildlife corridors and to look holistically at what could be done to promote biodiversity throughout the village.
